Vision Screening Results

No observable vision problems.

- Rescreen your child's vision annually or sooner if any concerns arise.

- Review Visual Development Guidelines with milestones specific to your child's visual development.

- If concerns arise, discuss them with a pediatric ophthalmologist, optometrist, or your primary care professional.

- Rescreen your child's vision annually.

Next Steps When Vision Concerns Are Observed

Please schedule a follow-up appointment with a medical professional(s) within the recommended timeframe. Make sure to bring both the Parent Questionnaire© you completed, which was previously sent to you by email, as well as this document. Also, be sure to discuss any vision concerns with your primary care professional to ensure they are fully informed and can provide a medical referral if necessary.

1. Schedule an appointment with a medical professional:

- Within 4 to 5 weeks, if possible
- Within 1 to 2 weeks **(URGENT)**
- Within 24 to 48 hours **(VERY URGENT)**

2. Follow up with a medical professional:

- Pediatric ophthalmologist
- Pediatric optometrist
- Primary care professional

3. If you are receiving early intervention services, discuss with your service coordinator adding an Early Intervention Teacher of the Visually Impaired (EI-TVI) to your care team. The teacher can assist you with eye appointments, as well as provide important information and strategies to support you and your child.

4. Find pediatric eye doctors in Colorado near you. You can find a list of pediatric ophthalmologists and optometrists, and their contact information by scanning the QR code with your smartphone's camera. Other valuable information for you and your child is also available on the website.
